Social poverty has reached critical levels across the country and a walk down Western Road will tell you that Brighton is no exception.

Off The Fence is a charity that tackles the roots of social poverty, and relieves its symptoms. Our teams work tirelessly across the city in 5 local schools, street outreach and 25 Day Centres, with a team of trained volunteers, staff and interns. The services we offer were accessed over 13,000 times in the last year, providing frontline, long-term and life-changing support. Who is Off The Fence here for?

Kids who need support

We're here for kids like Ben, whose struggles with school led to social isolation and disruptive behaviour. Through our group workshops and individual mentoring, Ben now has the tools to manage his feelings. His teachers have seen a marked improvement in his schoolwork and friendships. Our Schools Team currently work across 15 schools delivering reflection spaces, workshops and mentoring.

Women at risk

We're here for women like Amber, whose experience with sustained abuse has led to mental health problems, isolation and financial hardship. Our Gateway Centre provides one to one support, home visits, accompaniment to appointments, help with paperwork, signposting, referrals, workshops and group activities. Amber now says that she doesn't feel like she's on her own anymore.

Rough sleepers and the homeless

And we're here for the people on Western Road, with hot food, sleeping bags and access to showers and laundry. As well as supplying basic needs and restoring dignity, Project Antifreeze helps with housing applications, addiction problems, and benefits forms. We also provide useful courses and workshops on detox, debt advice, first aid, employment, self-esteem and wellbeing. One of our clients is Stan. Since using our services, he has beaten his addictions and now has a job and a home.

Thanks to your support, we are here for Stan, Amber and Ben, and so many others like them. When you walk down Western Road, you won't see Stan there. Your support helps us make sure you never see Amber or Ben there, either.

- A float, for change
- A team of helpers



Sponsored Event

This could be...

- Sleep out
- 5k, 10k, marathon
- Dress down day
- Sea swim (in winter!)
- Zumbathon
- Abseiling

You will need...

- A JustGiving page and/OR the attached sponsorship form
- People to sponsor you
- Publicity – use social media and don't forget to tag us!

Tip: people will sponsor you for three reasons:

1. they understand the importance of the cause you're supporting
2. what you're doing is challenging
3. if you remember to ask them



Where the money goes

£17

would buy 1 sleeping bag.

£20

would fund an hour of drop-in sessions at Gateway.

£50

would help with equipment and resources for safe-spaces and school-requested courses such as our 'Where's Your Head At' self-esteem courses.

£750

would provide material supplies for one year at Gateway's weekly craft & art therapy classes.

£1,000

would allow the ongoing supply of food from a local agency for Antifreeze for a year.

£4,500

would keep our outreach vans staffed and running for a month.
